

New plants on the roof terrace



During the fall all plants on the terrace have been replaced with new ones. A number of the existing plants had withered away and the rest did not look at all good due to the fact that they had not been watered properly and that the soil was of poor quality.

New soil has now been received as well as fresh plants and a water tap

The plants are a mix of ordinary beech and red beech. In the area facing the canal two kinds of spirea have been planted, and in between the gardener has planted 1000 crocuses, already visible as tokens the approaching spring.

At the same time a new agreement has been entered into with the janitor. He will be in charge of the watering when required and will remove weeds from the pots and from the flagstones. The beeches will be trimmed twice a year. Residents are responsible for the maintenance of their own terrace spaces and for watering of their own plants.

We hope all residents will contribute to taking good care of the new plants for ensuring that we can enjoy them for many years to come.

Please note that new plants have not been put in the four flowerboxes located under the balconies but they have been filled with new soil. We hope that the residents in the flats closest by will fill them with plants they wish to have and in agreement with the neighbours and that they they will take charge for watering them.
